Sharon Teal Texas Democratic Women, for the first time in its 17 year history, is making political contributions to democratic women candidates running for state offices. The money raised at our convention and through donations has generated enough capital to make financial contributions to twelve candidates and fund an aggressive Get-Outthe-Vote effort.

TDW is supporting candidates running for seats in the Texas House, Texas Senate, and the Courts of Appeals. The candidates had to have a republican opponent, a strong commitment to the mission of TDW, a viable campaign plan, and the dedication and endurance to win a campaign. TDW is sending money now and women later.

It is critical that a candidate's Texas Ethics Commission report, as of July 15th, reflect large sums of money raised in order to show potential donors the candidate is serious and viable. In addition to the state organization contributing money, the board is challenging its members to make individual contributions now and throughout the campaign.

After the national convention TDW will roll out its coordinated GOTV effort. The board, past presidents, local chapters, campaigns, and other organizations will contribute to and execute a comprehensive voter contact plan. We will send TDW mailers to targeted voters, walk door-to-door, operate phone banks, and drive voters to the polls. We need to mobilize no less than 5,000 volunteers across the state.

There are eighteen democratic women candidates with opponents running for a state office seat. The twelve who responded to our questionnaire are receiving TDW financial support. Each will also be given the opportunity to work with TDW and to utilize our volunteer resources to get them elected. We are proud to announce the twelve candidates TDW is supporting:
